
SKACAS Strengthens Academic Progress Through Review Meeting

Jane Austen (1775–1817) was an English novelist known for her sharp social observations, irony, and portrayals of women navigating love, class, and marriage in Regency England. Though her works were initially published anonymously, she is now celebrated as one of the greatest English novelists.

Pride and Prejudice (1813) remains Austen's most popular novel. It follows Elizabeth Bennet, a witty and independent young woman, as she encounters Mr. Darcy, a wealthy yet seemingly proud man. Through their evolving relationship, Austen critiques the rigid class system and gender expectations of her time while exploring the dangers of pride, prejudice, and misjudgment.
